



Scholarship Information

The Nashville Jazz Workshop has been fortunate to receive a grant from the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee to provide scholarship opportunities for students in need of financial assistance at the Jazz Workshop. Scholarship assistance is available to high school and college students as well as adults. Following are guidelines and procedures for scholarship aid.

1. Scholarship assistance is available for low income students. For high school and college students, this is indicated by the need for some form of financial aid (e.g., lunch program, tuition grant). For adult students, this is defined as a gross income that is less than 200% of the federally-defined poverty level. Applicants may be asked to document this with Federal income tax forms.
2. A goal of the scholarship program is to increase diversity and access to Jazz Workshop classes. Students from ethnic minority groups who need financial aid are encouraged to apply. Scholarship assistance is not limited, however, to students from these groups.
3. For high school students, application should include a recommendation from your music teacher.
4. In addition to need, other factors will be considered, including the student's motivation, interest, and level of ability. Scholarship recipients will be students at all levels of ability.
5. Scholarship applicants will be asked to complete a brief audition.
6. Decisions on scholarship awards will be made by a committee composed of:
 - a. One or more of the NJW Directors
 - b. A representative of the NJW Board
 - c. Two NJW faculty members (vocal and instrumental)
7. Scholarships will be awarded for one six-week session at a time; the scholarship committee may elect to extend the scholarship to subsequent sessions based on factors such as attendance, motivation, and student progress. Scholarships may be full, three-quarters, or half tuition.
